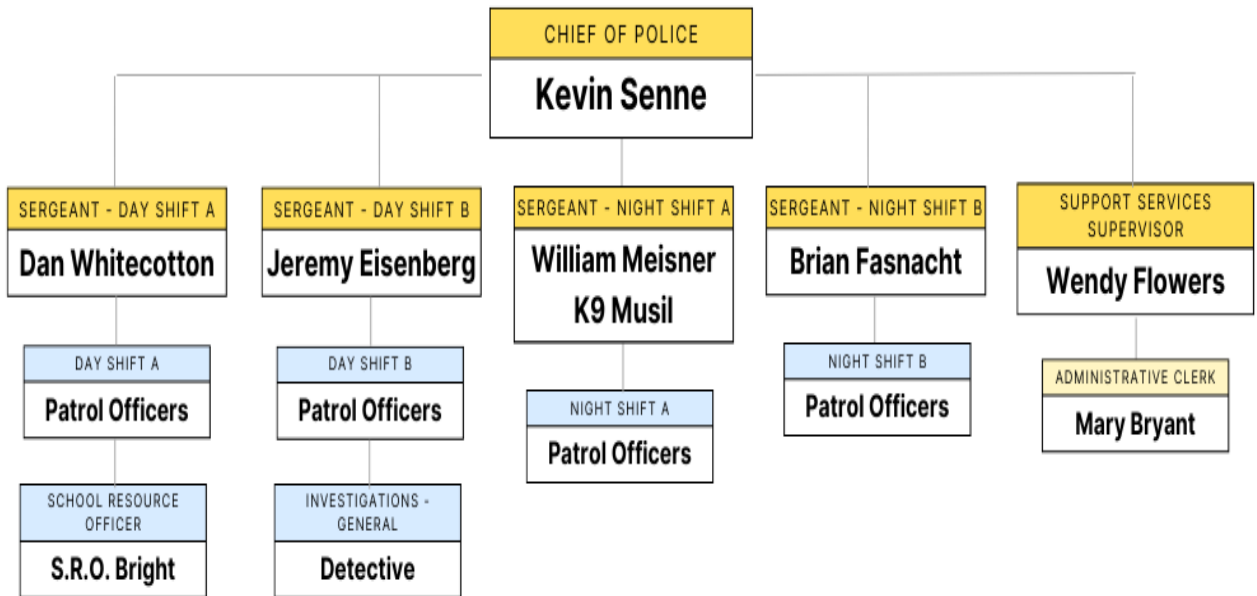
Sandwich Police Department Mission Statement

ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE



Sworn Personnel

The Sandwich Police Department has an authorized strength of fifteen sworn full-time police officers, encompassing the ranks of Chief of Police, Sergeant, and Patrol Officer. Officers assigned to the Patrol Division vigilantly patrol the City of Sandwich to detect and prevent crime. Daily, our officers assist citizens, assist other law enforcement agencies, engage in community events, participate in the schools, and enforce criminal and traffic laws. All patrol officers are required to complete sixteen weeks of basic law enforcement instruction, or equivalent, at a certified Illinois police academy. When a new officer returns from the police academy, the officer participates in a twelve-week field training program where the officer is paired with several Field Training Officers (FTOs). After the officer completes the field training program, he/she is authorized for solo patrol. A new police officer is continually reviewed during a one-year probationary period to ensure that the officer is progressing properly and meeting department standards. Patrol officers are sent to specialized training for DUI detection, investigative techniques, breathalyzer operations, annual law updates, and other classes based on availability. Sandwich Police Officers wear many hats and often play dual roles in the department. Our officers hold specialty positions such as DARE Officer, Evidence Custodian, Crime Scene/Evidence Technician, K9 Officer, Range Master, Firearms Armorer, Field Training Officer, etc. The police department drove over 115,000 miles last year patrolling the city.

Investigative roles with the Sandwich Police Department may include a general assignment detective and a School Resource Officer dedicated to Sandwich CUSD #430. Our investigators are members of the DeKalb County Major Crimes Squad, a multijurisdictional countywide initiative that is periodically activated to investigate the most serious of crimes. Criminal investigations initiated by the Patrol Division that require considerable time and effort are assigned to the Investigation Division. Having members of the police department dedicated to investigating complex and time-consuming cases allows members of the Patrol Division to remain “on the street,” responding to the needs of the community promptly. Members of the Investigations Division participate in monthly multi-jurisdictional detective and gang meetings to share and obtain intelligence with surrounding law enforcement agencies. The police department followed up on seventy cases and executed four search warrants.

This past August, we provided the school district with a School Resource Officer, Officer Eric Bright.

Civilian Personnel

The Sandwich Police Department Support Services Division includes a Supervisor and an Administrative Clerk who facilitates the Adjudication Program and Community Relations initiatives. Our Support Services Division engages in various clerical and administrative tasks, including maintaining an organized filing system, managing payments, assisting in budgeting, preparing reports, communicating with surrounding State's Attorney's Offices, and so much more.

There has been an increase over the past three years in traffic-related matters. However, we saw a small decrease in traffic crashes in 2024

Training Summary

Two officers in 2024 completed 16 weeks of basic police academy training.

Seven officers had to complete the Field Training Program. The Field Training Program is designed to give the officers the skills and knowledge necessary to become effective and competent police officers. The officers respond to calls with a Field Training Officer. The department had four officers who had been trained to be FTOs. Field training lasts between 10-12 weeks until an officer is released to solo patrol. Officers remain on probation for one year. This allows the department to make sure we have well-trained officers who are serving our community.

In 2024, the Sandwich Police Department conducted over 1,000 hours of training. Some of the training included the following:

In addition to this training, the department members each month are required to complete two law update cases along with monthly online training by the Police Law Institute that covers topics such as arrest, search, use of force, de-escalation tactics, implicit bias, and vehicle pursuits.

Oxcart Permits



The Sandwich Police Department partnered with Oxcart Permit Systems for overweight and oversized vehicles in April of 2024.

The police department approved sixty permits, resulting in \$4,925 in fees for the city.

This program is all done online, with the average approval taking a member of the police department less than a minute to approve.

Use of Force and Internal Review

Summary

In 2024, the department had fifteen incidents when use of force was used. When looking at the incidents, the most common use of force was an arm takedown and one case where a taser was displayed but not used. In nine cases, some type of impairment was detected in the individual that force was used against, and in seven cases, the person was determined to have some type of emotional issue occurring. Seven of the calls were domestic-related. Sunday was the day in which most use of force occurred being five with Saturday having three. Twelve of the cases involved men, and three involved women. Twelve cases involved White individuals, two cases Hispanic, and one case African American.

In 2024, the department had three cases of internal review, all of which were generated by the police department. Here is a summary of the cases:

- Traffic Crash- Matter was sustained
- Conduct- Matter was sustained
- Conduct- The matter was not completely investigated due to the officer resigning

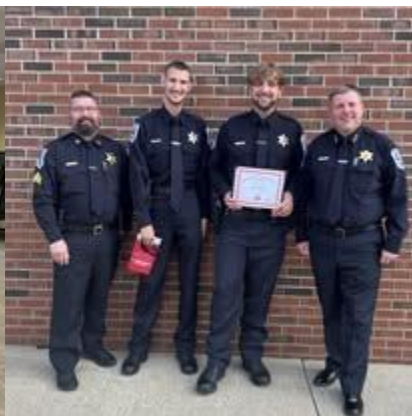
