
## **Sandwich Police Department Mission Statement**

## **Personnel and Staffing**

During 2025, the Sandwich Police Department maintained staffing levels while continuing recruitment efforts to prepare for future vacancies and growth.

- **Sworn Officers:** 15
- **Command Staff:** Chief, 4 Sergeants
- **Civilian/Support Staff:** 2

Recruitment efforts resulted in a strong applicant pool, with both entry-level and lateral candidates participating in the testing process.

## Crime and Enforcement Results

Crime in 2025 was **down 11.97%** for Type A offenses.

Our **arrest rate increased to 49.51%**, compared to **33.33% in 2024**, reflecting both proactive policing and effective case follow-through.

Our call volume is almost 85 % proactive.

In 2025, we had 22,042 Calls for service compared to 19,481 in 2024.

# Traffic Enforcement & Crash Data (2022–2025)

A review of traffic data over the past four years shows a significant increase in proactive traffic enforcement, along with a stabilization of traffic crashes.

## Key Trends:

### Traffic Stops

- 2022: 486
- 2023: 703
- 2024: 3,096
- 2025: 3,803

Traffic stops increased substantially beginning in 2024 and continued rising in 2025. This reflects a strong emphasis on proactive traffic enforcement and roadway safety initiatives.

### DUI Arrests

- 2022: 3
- 2023: 20
- 2024: 33
- 2025: 47

DUI arrests have steadily increased each year, indicating focused enforcement efforts on impaired driving.

### DWLR/DWLS Arrests

- 2022: 7
- 2023: 8
- 2024: 34
- 2025: 49

There has been a marked increase in arrests for Driving While License Revoked/Suspended, particularly beginning in 2024.

### No Valid Driver's License Arrests

- 2022: 4
- 2023: 9
- 2024: 8
- 2025: 19

These arrests have also trended upward overall, with a notable increase in 2025.

### Traffic Crashes

- 2022: 115

- 2023: 123
- 2024: 120
- 2025: 118

While enforcement activity increased dramatically, traffic crashes have remained relatively stable and have slightly decreased from the 2023 high.

---

## **Overall Assessment**

Since 2024, the department has significantly increased proactive traffic enforcement efforts. Despite this large increase in traffic stops and DUI-related arrests, traffic crashes have remained steady and have slightly declined.

This trend suggests that enhanced traffic enforcement and officer presence are contributing positively to roadway safety in the City of Sandwich.

## Training Summary

In 2025, two officers completed the Field Training Program (FTO). This program is designed to provide newly hired officers with the skills, knowledge, and practical experience necessary to become effective and competent police officers. Officers respond to calls for service alongside a certified Field Training Officer and remain on probationary status for one year. This process allows the Department to ensure officers are properly trained and prepared to serve the community.

During 2025, department members attended training in the following areas:

- Acting Officer in Charge
- High-Risk Traffic Stops
- Red Dot Pistol
- Human Trafficking
- Basic Traffic Investigation
- Axon Convention

In total, department members completed **over 2,000 hours of training** in 2025.

In addition to specialized and in-person training, department members are required each month to complete two law update case reviews, along with monthly online training provided by the Police Law Institute. These trainings cover critical topics including arrest and search procedures, use of force, de-escalation tactics, implicit bias, and vehicle pursuits.

## Oxcart Permits

The Sandwich Police Department continued its partnership with Oxcart Permit Systems for overweight and oversized vehicle permits in 2025. During the year, the Police Department approved sixty-five (65) permits, generating **\$7,725** in fees for the City.

This program is administered entirely online, with the average permit approval requiring **less than one minute** of staff time.




## Support Services Division

The Support Services Division is responsible for the following functions:

- Records and statistical management
- Logistical services, including budgeting and fiscal management
- Ordinance enforcement
- Adjudication administration
- School crossing guard program
- Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) compliance
- Court subpoenas
- Building maintenance
- Purchasing and procurement
- Expungement and sealing of records

### 2025 Activity Summary

- FOIA requests processed: **132**
- Court subpoenas handled: **148**
- Adjudication cases managed: **368**



## Evidence Summary

This summary reflects the evidence workload from **January 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024**.

- Items collected: **99**
- Items returned to owner: **4**
- Items destroyed: **225**
- Items retained for department use: **8**
- Items transferred to another agency: **9**

**Total pieces of evidence in custody: 5,512**



## Equipment Summary – 2025

In 2025, the Sandwich Police Department invested in the following equipment to enhance operational efficiency and officer safety:

- Four (4) new squad cars
- New desktop computers for department use
- New protective shields installed in all squad cars
- New portable breath alcohol testing devices
- Tasers for officer use



## Use of Force Summary – 2025

In 2025, the Sandwich Police Department documented **ten (10) use-of-force or show-of-force incidents**.

### Type of Force Used

- The most common application of force was an **arm takedown**.
- **Two (2) tasers were deployed**.
- **Five (5) incidents involved the display of a taser without deployment**.

### Subject Conditions

- **Three (3) incidents** involved individuals identified as impaired.
- **Six (6) incidents** involved individuals experiencing an emotional or mental health-related issue.

### Timing of Incidents

Use-of-force incidents occurred most frequently on **weekend days (Friday, Saturday, and Sunday)**.

### Demographics

- **Gender:**
  - Eight (8) male subjects
  - Two (2) female subjects
- **Race/Ethnicity:**
  - Six (6) White individuals
  - Three (3) African American individuals
  - One (1) Hispanic individual

Overall, use-of-force incidents decreased in 2025 compared to 2024, when the department documented **fifteen (15) incidents**.

## Internal Review Summary – 2025

In 2025, the Department conducted **six (6) internal review investigations**, all initiated internally by the Police Department.

### Case Outcomes:

- **Neglect of Duty** – Sustained
- **Misuse of Department Property** – Sustained
- **Conduct** – Exonerated
- **Conduct / Pursuit** – Sustained (3 cases)

These reviews reflect the Department's commitment to accountability, transparency, and maintaining professional standards.

# New Hires, Retirements, & Awards – 2025

## New Hires

In 2025, the Sandwich Police Department welcomed the following new officers:

These additions strengthen our patrol division and support our continued focus on proactive policing and community safety.

## Resignation

- **Officer Chris Vega** resigned in March 2025 to accept a position with the Chicago Police Department. We thank Officer Vega for his service to the City of Sandwich and wish him continued success in his law enforcement career.

## Professional Development

- Sergeant Jeremy Eisenberg successfully completed the prestigious **Northwestern University School of Police Staff and Command** program in 2025. This advanced leadership training enhances the department's supervisory capabilities and long-term organizational development.
